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AG SHOWS RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

“Rich Fruit Cake”

<u>INGREDIENTS</u>	<u>RECOMMENDED METHOD:</u>
250g sultanas 250g chopped raisins 250g currants 125g chopped mixed peel 90g chopped red glace cherries 90g chopped blanched almonds 250g plain flour 60g self-raising flour ¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg ½ teaspoon ground ginger ½ teaspoon ground cloves 250g butter 250g soft brown sugar ½ teaspoon lemon essence OR Finely grated lemon rind ½ teaspoon almond essence ½ teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs 1/3 cup sherry or brandy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. • Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. • Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. • Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8"x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin. • NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Winners at country show will each receive a cash prize of \$25 and will be required to bake a second “Rich Fruit Cake” to compete in a Group Final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.

The Group Final will be judged at the January 2025 AGM.

The fourteen winners at Group level will each receive a cash prize of \$50 and are required to bake a third “Rich Fruit Cake” for the Final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.

Judges Note:

- All fruit cakes to be cut in half when being judged.
- The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)

NB: Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final and only one Group in a State Final.
